

Step 1: Measure a black c/s panel $4-1/8 \ge 5-1/4$. Find the center of the top edge and cut 2" down. Measure 1" on both sides of the center and score at an angle down to the end of the slit. Fold to form lapels. Snip little 'V' cuts into lapels. (Right photo)



Step 3: Flip both pieces over to the front side and slightly overlap the two halves to create the jacket front. The width of the jacket will measure 4". (Right photo)

3d168 - Tuxedo Card

Step 2: Cut the tux in half using the lapel cut line as the guide. Flip both pieces to the reverse side and affix 1/8" strip of Scor Tape or similar along the left side of the jacket. (Left photo)






Step 5: Affix a 1/8" strip close to the back of the collar and affix at the center of a piece of white 3"x3". Trim the corners to create a tag shape close to the collar. (Right photo)


Step 4: Cut a white strip 1/2" x 3". To form the collar shape, find the center and fold both ends toward the middle while angling slightly to create the collar shape. (Left photo)

Step 7: To create the tie and ascot, cut 2 pieces of ribbon 6" and 3". For the tie, loosely tie once as if you are creating a knot (Photo A). Tighten the and look for the knot to form in a Windsor shape (Photo B). The top ribbon end will be threaded through a hole punched just under the center of the collar. (Arrow marked C).

For the ascot, lay a strip of Scor Tape on the reverse side of the ribbon. (Photo D) Fold into a pointy shape (Photo E). Before trimming off the tails of the ribbon, affix a piece of Scor Tape to the back of the triangle (not shown)



Cut 2 pockets and fold in half and tape each side. Corner round bottom corners. Cut a little strip to create a finished look to the pockets. Stamp a sentiment and cut it into a ticket shape using a 1/4" hole punch at each corner.
